JOHN JAMIAN, DEPUTY ADMINISTRATOR OF U.S. MARITIME
ADMINISTRATION WILL BE GUEST SPEAKER AT 17TH ANNUAL
WINDSOR MARINE NIGHT

Detroit, Michigan, U.S.A.-On tomorrow, Thursday, April 29, 2004, John Jamian, Deputy Administrator of the U.S. Maritime Administration will be the guest speaker at the 17th Annual Windsor Marine Night in Windsor, Ontario. The Windsor Marine Night has become an important Great Lakes marine event annually bringing together representatives of the Canadian and US marine community for golf, dinner and networking. This year's event will be held at the Cleary International Centre in Windsor. Mr. Jamian will speak on the challenges of balancing trade with security. His speech will occur between 8:15 P.M. and 9:15 P.M.

“We are happy to have John back to the Detroit area to update us on Washington's latest information regarding port security and related topics,”said Steven Olinek, Deputy Director of the Detroit/Wayne County Port Authority (DWCPA). Mr. Jamian is recognized for his leadership and experience in the international transportation and trade field. Prior to his appointment by President Bush to the Maritime Administration in 2003, Mr. Jamian served as DWCPA's Executive Director. He was a
